Vierumäki Face of the Day



Each day, one player at the 2008 IIHF Women's Hockey Development Camp will be featured as the Camp's Face of the Day. Today, Team Maroon's Anja Weissler from Germany is highlighted.

It's all hockey, all the time for Team Maroon's Anja Weissler. In addition to playing with a women's team back home in Germany, she also practices with a men's team and plays a few games with another men's team.

All of the hard work and time on ice has paid off for Anja, who was most recently a part of the German Women's national U18 team at the first ever World

U18 Championship in Canada last winter where her team finished in fifth place. Anja, a defenseman, finished the tournament with one goal.

"It was a great experience to play at the U18 championship," said Anja. "To see the level of all the countries was a good lesson."

Another good lesson for Anja has been this year's Development Camp, where she is getting into the international flavor of her team and the camp.

"The best thing here in Finland is being around people from all the different nations," said Anja. "It's been really unique to be on such a diverse team."

Anja had a bit of bad luck as she learned just before today's practice that she would be out for two weeks after hurting her knee in action yesterday. But it's just a minor setback for gritty and determined German, who has her sights set on playing for the women's national team.

Germany will play in the qualification tournament for the 2010 Olympics in Vancouver, which could be perfect timing for Anja.

"To play in Vancouver, that would be amazing," Anja says with a smile.

Next year the World Women's U18 Championship will be expanded to include a Division I level. That means that six more nations will be able to enter national teams in the event. The top level will be played with eight teams in Füssen, Germany. Finland will host this year's senior Women's Championship in Hameenlinna.
